which will be completed in May 2014.

Authorization for Payment of Vouchers & Payroll

Program Oversight Committee Update Warrant Numbers 10608 through 10640 for March 2014 for payment in the amount of \$162,142.42 were presented for approval (E:20:14). *Motion was made, seconded and passed unanimously to approve.*

The Program Oversight Committee met on April 14, 2014 to review five new program funding applications (E:21:14).

No conflicts of interest were reported by the commissioners.

New Funding Applications:

Motion was made, seconded and passed unanimously to approve \$10,000 on a one-time basis for the Lutheran Community Services Back to School Health Fair.

Not Recommended for Funding at this time:

Run to Win Take Action Program as the program is not closely enough connected to Verdant' mission.

City of Lynnwood Farmer's Market Education Program as there were concerns about how well the program would actually be able to engage community members in nutrition education in a market setting and how Verdant would know whether the program actually helped improve people's eating habits and attitudes.

Integrated Psychological & Social Services as there were concerns with the very short organizational and financial track record for the applicant.

Need more information:

Kindering South Snohomish County Expansion. Kindering is based in Bellevue but would like to open a Bothell location. Commissioners will schedule a session with Kindering to obtain more information on their funding request.

Follow-up on Puget Sound Kidney Center:

Commissioners Wilson & Knowles will meet with the Kidney Center to view their presentation before a final decision is made on funding.

Marketing Report Ms. Piplic presented the Marketing Report (E:22:14). Commissioners are welcome to attend any of the remaining sessions of "6 Weeks to a Healthier You" which has 260 registrants. A thank-you reception with debriefing will be held approximately two weeks after the close of 6 Weeks. Date to be announced. Commissioners are also encouraged to attend the "groundbreaking" ceremony on May 1, 2014

Superintendent's Report

Superintendent Zapora reported on four items:

- 1. The Strategic Collaboration Committee is meeting on Thursday, April 24, 2014 to review updates on Swedish/Edmonds and Verdant.
- 2. The board will hold a mini retreat on Friday, June 27, 2014, 12 to 5 p.m. at the Lynnwood Convention Center. This retreat is a public meeting.
- 3. The official name of Verdant's new facility is the Verdant Community Wellness Center. This facility is possibly the state's first *community* wellness center.
- 4. We are delighted to have Ms. Sue Waldin on staff with Verdant. She will assist Mr. Kosovich with the nearly 80 programs we have funded to date and will play a key role in organizing and developing community health and wellness programs to take place in Verdant's Community Wellness Center. There were 77 applications received, eight interviews, and Sue was selected as our first choice.

Public Comments

Ms. Sarah Olson from the City of Lynnwood thanked the commissioners for their consideration of the funding request for the Lynnwood Farmer's Market and invited the commissioners to visit the market which opens on June 12, 2014 and runs on Thursday evenings until September 25, 2014, 3 to 7 p.m. at Wilcox Park. Ms. Olson asked the commissioners to re-consider the application as there is a health education component but also mentioned that the city is interested in collaborating at the Verdant Community Wellness Center after it opens.

Mr. Bob Hegamin presented a copy of his book, "3 Silent Killers: Diabetes, Hypertenstion, Obesity."

Mr. Al Rutledge commented on the number of new senior living residences in the Alderwood/Lynnwood area and that Verdant should introduce themselves to the new residents coming in 2015.

WHEREAS, the Commission has determined that it is necessary to amend the 2014 Budget to address changes in the District's operation since the 2014 Budget was originally adopted; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMISSION OF PUBLIC HOSPITAL DISTRICT NO. 2, SNOHOMISH COUNTY, WASHINGTON, that the amended budget for 2014, in the form attached hereto as Exhibit B, is hereby adopted.







Recommended for Funding

• American Red Cross - CPR training for vulnerable populations: a renewal request to provide funding for CPR classes for South County community organizations and residents. Last year, Verdant provided \$10,000 for one-year, and the Red Cross is on track to serve 165 individuals. All of the trainings would occur in South Snohomish County; example organizations have included non-profits, parent groups, childcare providers, and the Center for Healthy Living. The program committee is recommending fully funding the request at \$10,000 per year for two years.

For Additional Discussion

- Puget Sound Christian Clinic (PSCC): two funding requests connected to a planned Lynnwood dental clinic:
 - 1. Start-up funding request of \$300,000 to be used for construction and equipment for the clinic, which would be located in a church space in Lynnwood, converted from a closed commercial gym (near Hwy 99 & 196th). The clinic would expect to provide 3,000-4,000 patient visits per year.
 - 2. Operating funding of \$150,000 per year for three years for the clinic to hire a full-time dental director and support staff and to oversee the work of volunteer dentists. The clinic is expected to operate 24 hours per week in the first year, increasing to 40-plus hours per week by the third year with additional volunteers and a residency program. The clinic will provide comprehensive dental care, including exams, x-rays, cleanings, fillings, crowns, and extractions.

The program committee directed Verdant staff to follow-up with the applicant to better understand how the new clinic would fit in with existing service providers, and to learn more about the long-term sustainability plan for the clinic. The committee also wanted to get feedback from the other Verdant board members on the clinic concept given the size of the request.

• Free Range Health – Expanded Low Cost Acupuncture Services: a renewal and expansion request to provide low-cost acupuncture services for seniors. Verdant currently funds a one-year pilot for \$21,209 at the Lynnwood Senior Center and the organization would like to expand to the Mountlake Terrace Senior Center, the Center for Healthy Living, and to provide in-home care. The program is designed to help patients cope with issues like pain and chronic conditions. To date, the program at the Lynnwood Senior Center has seen 117 individuals in Lynnwood and has been tracking self-reported measures like pain and energy levels.

The committee had some reservations and concerns about the size and scale of the expansion request (\$121,090 per year for two years). There was not consensus among committee members so the request is being forwarded to the board for discussion.

Follow-up on Previous Applications

Puget Sound Kidney Center Foundation – Chronic Kidney Disease Education and Prevention Program: a revised request for a new program focused on helping to reduce the progression of kidney disease. The request would fund 1.1 FTE positions for a program manager, social worker, dietician, and a nurse. The program would expect to serve a minimum of 50 individuals per year out of the organization's Mountlake Terrace office, and outcomes would be focused on keeping patients off of dialysis and increasing use of home therapy options. The revised request is \$70,000 in year 1, \$50,000 in year 2, \$40,000 in year 3.

Board members have now all met with the applicant to learn more about how the program fits in with Puget Sound Kidney Center's existing programs and services as well as how it connects to other health education programs in the community. The Verdant board now needs to decide what action it would like to take regarding the funding application.
