Superintendent Report:

Dr. Edwards, provided an update on Verdant operations and outreach.

Verdant Operations Update

She thanked Debbie Beaman for her service as Verdant's interim Executive Assistant/Office Manager. Dr Edwards also thanked Sandra Huber, Nancy Budd, and Monika Star for their continued work in programming and community connections and highlighted the numerous classes included in the board meeting packet (E:17:22)

Community Outreach Update

Dr. Edwards reported that we have increased program offerings and content online to grow awareness of Verdant and its mission. She thanked Alex Franco, Thea Walker, and Tina Sypaphay for their work in the Marketing department. (E:18:22). Dr. Edwards encouraged all attendees to 'like' and follow Verdant's social media pages. Verdant will host an Opioid Crisis Roundtable on March 10, 2022 at 6-7pm. President Distelhorst will act as the moderator for this event.







Verdant Community Social Worker Highlights: February 2022 / March 2022

- Case Management continuing support for 15 clients.
- CHART Leadership and Facilitation Lisa and I have met with The Next Step on several occasions to ensure they are meeting their stated goals. We are very pleased with their progress, including adding an additional 5 clients, and several providers.
- This past month included weekly team check ins, monthly staff meeting, monthly County Outreach Coalition, monthly Snohomish County Community Behavioral Health Committee, Snohomish County Connector's meeting, Monthly County and Human Services Providers Call, monthly Vulnerable Adult Taskforce, monthly Homeless Policy Task Force. Webinars included Understanding Narcissistic Personality Disorder, Understanding Seasonal Affective Disorder, Understanding Body Dysmorphic Disorder, Understanding Avoidant/Restrictive Food Intake Disorder.
- I returned to weekly outreach to the hospital. To date, I have received a total of 43 referrals. Eleven of these referrals have been successful in following through for case management services. Ten referrals did not follow through in engaging in services, 8 went on to other programs, and 3 engaged, and then disappeared. In addition, I have consulted on another 11 patient cases, and referred to more appropriate programs.
- Supporting Affordable Counseling's intern with an 8-week depression and anxiety support group. This group will be finishing at the end of March. Intern reports 6 regular attendees. Following this group, another 8-week understanding anxiety and depression support group will begin through Sound Choices Counseling.
- Working with a local church to provide a trauma informed training for staff working with individual crises, and will offer to entire congregation.
- Working with the Waterfront Center in Edmonds to provide a Mental Health First Aid class.

The Facebook page gained new 17 followers and lost 5 followers, resulting in 12 new followers. The Facebook page also reached to 16,721 people, due to the Opioid Crisis Community Round-Table advertisement disbursement. We spent \$203.80 on the advertisement. The post with the most reach this period is the Happy National Employee Appreciation Day post. The post reached 1,189 people, has 250 engagements, 20 reactions, and 4 shares. The post's insight displays how appreciated our staff by our followers.

The Instagram page reached to 298 people, which is 47.5% more than last period. The profile visits went down to 91, which is 20.9% percent lower than last period. The decrease in profile visits may be caused to not linking our Instagram posts to our Facebook page.




