The committee met on September 19, 2014. Ms. King reviewed the financial statements and cash activity for

August 2014 (E:52:14).

Commissioner Williams asked for clarification on the money that is budgeted for programs but is not spent in Commissioners Meeting September 24, 2014 Page 2

2014. Ms. King explained that currently there is \$1,294,036 for programs of which \$228,528 is earmarked as Superintendent Discretionary. The approximate remaining \$1 million is left to spend on programs in 2014. Ms. King clarified that any unspent program funds are returned to the general fund and will be reallocated in the 2015 budget.

Authorization for Payment of Vouchers & Payroll

Warrant Numbers 10784 through 10810 for August 2014 for payment in the amount of \$648,896.39 were presented for approval (E:53:14). *Motion was made, seconded and passed unanimously to approve.*

Resolution 2014:06 Surplus Property Resolution 2014:06 deeming certain personal property as surplus and no longer needed for public hospital district purposes, approving the sale of the personal property and authorizing and directing the superintendent of the District to negotiate, execute and deliver a purchase and sale agreement with respect to such personal property. *Motion was made, seconded and passed unanimously to approve Resolution 2014:06.* E:54:14 details the three motor vehicles that were sold to Best Auto Parts in Lynnwood, WA on September 12, 2014.

Capital Asset Policy

Motion was made, seconded and passed unanimously to approve the Revised Capital Asset Policy (E:55:14).

Program
Oversight
Committee
Update

The Program Oversight Committee met on September 19, 2014 to review five new program funding applications and follow up on four applications. (E:56:14).

Commissioner Knutsen reported that she has one conflict of interest as she is on the board of Washington CAN which has a proposal being considered. Commissioner Knutsen reported that she has recused herself from all conversations on the proposal and receives no monetary benefit from her Washington CAN board position. She will recuse herself from voting on the proposal at this board meeting. No other conflicts of interest were reported by the remaining commissioners.

New Funding Applications:

Motion was made, seconded and passed by three commissioners with one abstention by Commissioner Knutsen to approve \$110,000 on a one time basis, with \$10,000 of the funds designated to match Robert Wood Johnson Foundation funding on a program evaluation for the Washington CAN Insurance Enrollment Outreach program. Mr. Will Pittz of Washington CAN explained the effectiveness of the strategy for ACA enrollment that they use which included door-to-door outreach. Mr. Pittz estimates that there are 20,000 people in this district who are eligible but still not enrolled in health insurance and they have knocked on 90% of the doors of households likely eligible for expanded Medicare.

Motion was made, seconded and passed unanimously to approve funding up to \$170,500 per year for three years to be paid out on the number of lesson vouchers redeemed for the Cities of Lynnwood, Mountlake Terrace, and Edmonds 3rd Grade Swim Lessons.

Motion was made, seconded and passed unanimously to approve \$29,000 per year for two years for the Snohomish County Music Project Music Futures Program for men suffering from depression and/or PTSD. Commissioner Williams inquired as to the availability of a mental health professional as part of this program. Mr. Kosovich stated that the music therapist is also a licensed mental health professional.

Not recommended for funding:

Mountlake Terrace Friends of the Arts, Art of the Terrace Display Panels; Washington State Family & Community Engagement Trust, Parent Leadership Training Institute; American Heart Association, Creating a Culture of Health; and Free Range Health, Expanded Low Cost Acupuncture Services.

Proposals for follow-up:

Snohomish County Health Leadership Coalition, YMCA of Snohomish County as Fiscal Sponsor. The Program Committee is recommending that the Coalition make a presentation to the board sharing the project results to-date and future goals. A board special meeting will be scheduled in the near future.

Swedish Foundation: the \$50,000 foundation request for the 2014 Gala will be forwarded to the Superintendent for consideration out of his discretionary fund. Commissioner Langer noted that the board would not take action on the \$1 million request because Commissioner Wilson is not in attendance and there are not enough voting members in attendance at this board meeting.

Marketing Report

Ms. Piplic introduced Ms. Beth Rodriguez as the interim marketing director from December 2014 through February 2015.

Commissioner Comments

Commissioner Williams commented on the need to support mental health services for young moms and their babies.

Superintendent's Report

Superintendent Zapora reported on three items:

- 1. Welcome to Beth Rodriguez
- 2. Superintendent's Discretionary Fund will be used to fund the \$50,000 request for the 2014 Gala per the request recommendation from the Program Committee. Superintendent was assured by Swedish/Edmonds that this is one-time only given that 2014 is the 50th anniversary of the hospital.
- 3. The Verdant Partner Roundtable met on September 22, 2014. This group consists of organizations providing health & wellness in the public hospital district and many received funding from Verdant for their programs. A board member from the Boeing Employee Community Fund presented to the group.

Public Comments

Ms. Rowena Miller of the League of Women Voters Snohomish County commented that mental health issues are important to the League as well. The League also appreciates the thoughtfulness of the commissioners when considering the distribution of funds to support district residents, and Ms. Miller appreciates that board members are speaking loudly at the meetings.

Drs. Brian Orr and Aaron Smith of the Interactive Health Clinic introduced themselves as naturopathic doctors who are gathering information on the community and how they can get involved. Commissioners Meeting September 24, 2014 Page 5

RESOLUTION NO. 2014-07

A resolution of the Commission of Public Hospital District No. 2, Snohomish County, Washington (the "District"), approving the dollar amount and percentage increase in the District's regular property tax levy for calendar year 2015.

WHEREAS, RCW 84.55.120 requires a taxing district, other than the state, that collects regular levies to hold a public hearing on revenue sources for the district's following year's current expense budget; and

WHEREAS, RCW 84.55.120 further requires the hearing to include consideration of possible increases in property tax revenues and requires that the hearing be held prior to the time the taxing district levies the taxes or makes the request to have the taxes levied; and

WHEREAS, RCW 84.55.120 authorizes the taxing district to hold a public hearing in conjunction with its annual budget hearing required by RCW 70.44.060(6); and

WHEREAS, a hearing in compliance with RCW 84.55.120 and RCW 70.44.060(6) was held on October 22, 2014; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners of the District, after hearing and duly considering all relevant evidence and testimony presented, determined that the District requires an increase in property tax revenue from the previous year, in addition to that resulting from the addition of new construction, increases in assessed value due to construction of electric generation wind turbine facilities classified as personal property, improvements to property and any increase in the value of state-assessed property, in order to discharge the expected expenses and obligations of the District; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED by the Commission of Public Hospital District No. 2, Snohomish County, Washington, as follows:

Section 1. The Board of Commissioners hereby determines that the District requires a regular levy in calendar year 2015 of \$2,190,000 which amount is exclusive of the additional tax revenue resulting from the addition of new construction, increases in assessed value due to construction of electric generation wind turbine facilities classified as personal property, improvements to property and any increase in the value of state-assessed property, and amounts authorized by law as a result of any refunds made, in order to discharge the expected expenses and obligations of the District.

Section 2. The Board of Commissioners hereby approves an increase in the District's regular property tax levy for calendar year 2015 in the amount of \$45,354.45, which is a percentage increase of 2.155% from calendar year 2014. This increase shall be in addition to the increase in tax revenue resulting from the addition of new construction, increases in assessed value due to construction of electric generation wind turbine facilities classified as personal property, improvements to property and any increase in the value of state-assessed property.

<u>Section 3</u>. The Superintendent is directed to certify to the County Assessor, no later than November 30, 2014, a copy of this Resolution showing its adoption; and to perform such other duties as are necessary or required by law to the end that the maximum levy capacity available to the District under chapter 84.55 RCW, as determined by the Washington State Supreme Court, is banked for use in future years.

October 2014 Program Committee Summary

Program Summary

- Four new funding applications and one follow-up from Verdant's regular grant programs.
- Twelve program requests were received under Verdant's behavioral health request for proposal. The program committee took an initial review of these proposals and will be following up with several applicants before returning to the board with recommendations.

Programs Recommended for Funding

- Cornerstone Medical Services Everyday Prevention & Benefits a program focused on Asian American residents of South Snohomish County. The program would include education on health insurance, health literacy issues (ex. nutrition, cancer prevention, fall prevention), and preventative screenings. The goal of the program is to reach 600 participants per year and the program would track insurance enrollment, and measures like increased use of preventative screenings. Cornerstone is a non-profit organization that would deliver the program out of a Lynnwood office and has experience conducting education around stomach cancer and health insurance enrollment. The program committee is recommending fully funding the program at \$60,000 per year for three years.
- Holly House For Kids Dental Supplies: an \$11,250 one-time request to purchase dental supplies for the Holly House program. Verdant funded the project last year at \$10,000 and funds were used to supply each child with 2 tooth brushes, 2 tubes of tooth paste, a 1 minute timer, dental floss, and education information on oral health practices. The program committee forwarded the request to the Superintendent's discretionary fund, and the Superintendent has approved the request.

Not Recommended for Funding

Snohomish Health District – Growing Healthy Together: a \$350,000 annual request to support a program for
pregnant and parenting women that would include nutrition and health counseling, food preparation training,
breastfeeding support and other resources. Funds would be used to support a team including a public health
nurse, dietician, and other support specialist. The goal of the program would be to reduce low-birth weight
deliveries, increase breastfeeding, and build on a social marketing campaign called 5210.

The program committee is not recommending the program for funding given the large request size and because the direct service pieces of the program would only serve 180 residents.

Proposals for Additional Discussion

• Omada Health – Diabetes Prevention Program: a concept proposal from a for-profit company that offers a diabetes prevention program that places participants into small online groups led by a professional health coach, who guides them through a 16 week curriculum with digital tools to track improvements in diet, physical activity, and weight loss. Unique to this program, Verdant would pay Omada based on the results of the program. The fee would be \$150 to \$800 per participant, which would be driven by engagement and measures like weight loss.

The program committee had some questions about the fit of this type of program with Verdant's priorities. Committee members saw value in diabetes prevention programs, but felt like these types of programs are being implemented as part of existing efforts by insurance companies. The committee members would be most interested in exploring a project that could reach individuals who do not have similar programs offered by their employer or insurance company.

- Snohomish County Health Leadership Coalition a request for additional funding for phase II and phase III of two initiatives:
 - Youth Activity Initiative, which is aimed at improving 5th grade activity levels;
 - Palliative Care Initiative: a community-based, palliative care consumer and physician/ARNPeducation program.

The board heard a presentation from the applicant at a study session on October 14 and will need to decide:

- 1. Should Verdant provide additional funding on the project?
- 2. If yes, at what level? The previous grant was \$125,000 and the grant request was for \$250,000 to support two additional years of programming.

Behavioral Health Request for Proposals

Twelve program requests were received under Verdant's behavioral health request for proposal. The program committee plans to set up in-person discussions with several applicants to answer questions about the proposals and identify the top contenders for funding.
