Call to Order	The Regular Meeting of the Board of Commissioners of Public Hospital District No. 2, Snohomish County, was called to order at 8:01 a.m. by President Knowles.
Approval of Minutes	<i>Motion was made, seconded and passed unanimously to approve</i> the minutes of the regular meeting on September 25, 2013.
	<i>Motion was made, seconded and passed unanimously to approve</i> the minutes of the special meeting on October 7, 2013.
Executive Committee	President Knowles reported that the Executive Committee met on October 18, 2013 to review the October 23, 2013 board meeting agenda. No action was taken.
Board Finance Committee	The committee met on October 18, 2013 to review the financial statements. Ms. King reported on the financials for September 2013 (E:58:13). Income reflects a 3% increase in rent each September from Swedish/Edmonds.
Authorization for Payment of	Warrant Numbers 10389 through 10415 for September 2013 for payment in the amount of \$59,177.24 were presented for

Program Oversight Committee Update approval (E:59:13). Motion was made, seconded and passed unanimously to approve.

Motion was made, seconded and passed unanimously to approve Resolution 2013:08 authorizing the Superintendent to sell all or any part of surplus personal property no longer required for public hospital district purposes.

President Knowles opened the public meeting regarding the Superintendent's proposed 2014 revenue and expenditure budget. Community members presented testimony.

Rowena Miller, 8711 182nd Pl. SW, Edmonds, WA 98206: She expressed concerns that the property tax 1% increase was not mentioned at the October 7, 2013 special board meeting or at her meeting with the Superintendent on October 9, 2013. She was concerned that PHD2 is not transparent and would like the board to reconsider the tax increase as many in the district are experiencing economic hardships.

Mary Hovander, 1009 Glen St., Edmonds, WA 98020, expressed disappointment with the lack of transparency.

Motion was made, seconded and passed unanimously to approve Resolution 2013:09 approving the dollar amount and 1 percent increase in the District's regular property tax levy for calendar year 2014.

Motion was made, seconded and passed unanimously to approve Resolution 2013:10 approving & adopting the district's budget as presented for calendar year 2014.

The Program Oversight Committee met on October 14, 2013 to review two new program funding applications, one pending application, and two renewal applications (E:61:13). No conflicts of interest were reported by the commissioners.

	New Program Applications: The committee is not recommending for funding the Puget Sound Kidney Center Foundation's Chronic Kidney Disease & Prevention Program and is also not recommending for funding the International Community Health Services Shoreline Clinic as the clinic resides in King County. Both Commissioner Knowles & Williams expressed interest in a reworked proposal from the Puget Sound Kidney Center Foundation.
	Follow-up Program Applications: The program committee and the Commissioners would like to see a more focused proposal from Fire District 1 on their Disaster Medicine project including other sources of funding they have secured.
	Renewal Program Applications for Funding: Motion was made, seconded and passed unanimously to approve ChildStrive (formerly Little Red Schoolhouse) Nurse Family Partnership in the amount of \$271,920 in 2014 and \$277,359 in 2015. Motion was made, seconded and passed unanimously to approve Puget Sound Christian Clinic's Edmonds Mobile Medical Clinic in the amount of \$90,000 per year for two additional years.
Marketing Report	Ms. Piplic reported on the latest issue of <i>The Canopy</i> , the three community leader meetings, the 6 Weeks to a Healthier You reunion session scheduled for November 4, 2013, the health fair with the Lynnwood Diversity Commission & WithinReach, and other upcoming community events (E:62:13). Commissioner Langer commented that due to <i>The Canopy</i> , a physician contacted him with information that he will pass along to the Program Committee.
Commissioner Comments	Commissioner Langer offered to meet with anyone from the public on the district budget process. He stated that transparency is very important to the board and we work to ensure that all statutory requirements are met. Commissioner Williams noted that the October 7, 2013 special meeting was a public meeting and all Finance Committee meetings are also public meetings with community involvement. Commissioner Williams also mentioned that Swedish/Edmonds has received an "A" rating from the Leapfrog Group, which is up from a previous

	"C" rating. Commissioner Knutsen noted that commissioners did not exchange email or telephone communication regarding the 2014 budget and that she has worked to make sure the board is transparent in its processes. Commissioner Knutsen also was pleased with the latest issue of <i>The Canopy</i> . Commissioner Knowles acknowledged the great work on The Canopy and the website.
Superintendent's Report	 Superintendent Zapora reported on four items: Verdant held a Community Partner meeting on October 18, 2013 with 25 in attendance at the new building. Lynne Vea of PCC Markets has also shared her input on the proposed demonstration kitchen/classroom. Superintendent Zapora attended the recent WSHA conference and also the Senior Services of Snohomish County luncheon where Verdant was presented with a Powerful Partners award for their partnership with Senior Services in 2013. Superintendent Zapora thanked the staff for their hard work on all the events in October 2013. The WSHA conference covered the issue of women's reproductive health. The attorney general's opinion is that if a public hospital district provides maternity services, it must provide the full range of women's reproductive services. This opinion will be further explored with legal counsel. Commissioner Knutsen commented that end-of-life issues also need to be examined along with women's reproductive issues.
Public Comments:	 Ms. Rowena Miller of the League of Women Voters asked when the Finance Committee meetings are held. Ms. King replied that they are usually held on the Friday before the monthly board meeting, @ Swedish/Edmonds hospital from noon to 1 PM. Ms. Miller also inquired about how the rest of the commissioners that do not attend the Finance Committee meeting are informed of the finances. Ms. King reported that the commissioners receive all the information through the board packet that is sent to them before the monthly board meeting. Commissioner Knutsen noted that the tax levy revenue was included in the budget that was presented at the October 7, 2013 special board meeting. The actual additional cost is 10 cents per resident per year. Commissioner Langer noted that the board follows the rules set by the legislature for

	transparency purposes and that he is willing to meet with anyone from the public on the process that the board follows. Ms. Mary Hovander of the League of Women Voters noted that the M&O levy amount on Line 74 of the budget presented at the October 7, 2013 meeting is different from Line 74 of the budget presented at today's board meeting. Ms. King explained that the levy amount on the October 7, 2013 budget was an estimate and that the county has since provided a more accurate figure.
Executive Session	President Knowles recessed the regular meeting at 9:06 a.m. into Executive Session to discuss ongoing litigation and potential real estate acquisition matters. President Knowles stated that the board would reconvene at 9:20 a.m. and the board may take action in Open Session. President Knowles extended the executive session until 9:40 a.m.
Open Session	President Knowles reconvened into open session at 9:42 a.m. The following action was taken: MOTION AUTHORIZING MEDICAL OFFICE BUILDING PURCHASE NEGOTIATONS
	The Board of Commissioners has determined that it may be in the District's best interests to acquire a medical office building to complement the District's hospital campus and to be leased to medical providers serving residents in the District and such acquisition shall produce a reasonable return to the District. The Board desires to authorize the Superintendent of the District to work with the District's advisers to pursue the possible purchase by the District, including making a purchase offer and if accepted to complete the purchase due diligence and, if a building is deemed suitable, negotiate on the District's behalf the final terms of a definitive purchase and sale agreement to be submitted to the Board once it is acceptable to the parties and the final due diligence is completed.
	ACCORDINGLY, IT IS HEREBY MOVED that the District's Superintendent is authorized to work with the District's advisers to make an initial offer for the purchase of a medical office building for possible purchase by the District, complete the final due diligence on the investment and, if the building is deemed suitable, negotiate on the District's behalf the final terms of the definitive purchase and

:

> sale agreement, which agreement shall be presented to the Board for its final review and consideration and which agreement shall not be legally binding on the District until all the final due diligence is completed and it has received the Board's approval to complete the transaction except that if the District were to decide to abandon the purchase agreement without reasonable cause the District would forfeit its earnest money in the amount of up to \$400,000.

Monthly Highlights September 2013

Verdant received dividends payments of \$82,446.17 and an unrealized gain of \$229,979 on our investement portfolio in September. A total of \$823,098 in dividends has been received in 2013 for a ending market value of \$42,301,593.

Annual program commitments total \$3,034,270 and \$3,016,166 for 2013 and 2014, respectively. Estimated board approved internal programs, including the Community Needs Assessment, total \$237,150 for 2013. \$3,028,580 remains available to spend in 2013, of which \$313,263 is earmarked as Superintendent Discretionary.

No unusual income or expenses were recorded in September.

New Program Applications for Funding

Not Recommended for Funding :

• Puget Sound Kidney Center Foundation – Chronic Kidney Disease Education and Prevention Program: a new program focused on helping to reduce the progression of kidney disease. The request would fund 2 full-time-equivalent positions for a program manager, social worker, dietician, and a nurse, and funds would also be used to develop curriculum for the program. The program would expect to serve 50 individuals per year out of the organization's Mountlake Terrace office, and outcomes would be focused on keeping patients off of dialysis and increasing use of home therapy options.

The program committee is not recommending this program for funding at this time. There were concerns about the program budget, which included \$100,000 for new curriculum development, and appeared to cost \$8,000-\$10,000 per patient served. The committee would be interested in exploring a smaller request focused on education that could clearly show how the program would engage earlier-stage patients in improving their health.

International Community Health Services - Shoreline Clinic: a one-time capital request of \$540,000 to support a new community health clinic at 165th and HWY 99 in Shoreline. The clinic would be focused on serving low-income families, including immigrants, and it is scheduled to open in June of 2014. An estimated 29% of patients would be expected to come from Verdant's district, with 90% coming from within a five mile radius of the clinic location. The committee is not recommending funding the request given that the site is located 2 miles outside of our district. To support this type of capital request for a community clinic, the committee felt that it was important for the clinic to be located in our district and serve a much higher percentage of district residents.

Follow-up on Previous Applications

• Snohomish County Fire District 1 - Disaster Medicine Project: a multi-year funding request to create a community-based disaster readiness program. The project would recruit military veterans and volunteers, train hospital staff and first responders, and conduct disaster exercises. Funds would be used for several new staff positions, exercises, and equipment. After further discussion and a Q&A session with the applicant, the program committee is recommending the applicant rework the proposal. The committee had some concerns about the size of the request and the budget given that the program will go from zero paid staff to the equivalent of 3.5 FTE to start. The committee sees the need for enhanced disaster readiness, but would be interested in seeing a more focused proposal.

Program Funding Renewal Requests

- ChildStrive (formerly Little Red Schoolhouse) Nurse Family Partnership: a home visiting program for first time young mothers. The renewal request would increase funding by 3% in 2014 and 2% in subsequent years. Overall, program results have been good; in the first year of the program participation was 33% higher than anticipated, and results were better than expected for measures like breastfeeding, immunization rates, and the mother's social/economic standing (ex. GED completion). The program committee is recommending funding the program for two addition years at the requested amount for \$271,920 in 2014 and \$277,359 in 2015.
- Puget Sound Christian Clinic (PSCC) Edmonds Mobile Medical Clinic: a weekly medical clinic in Edmonds that serves uninsured individuals, focusing on chronic health conditions like high blood pressure and diabetes. The applicant is requesting three additional years of funding. During the first year of the program, the clinic was at 96% of its goal for number of patients served. The program met its goals for return visits and improvements in chronic conditions measures, and the clinic is also now an enrollment site for Affordable Care Act (ACA) enrollment activities. The program committee is recommending funding the program for two additional years at \$90,000 per year.

<u>Section 1.</u> It is hereby found, determined and declared that all of the personal property identified on Exhibit A hereto is no longer required for public hospital district purposes and such property therefore is surplus. It is further found and declared to be in the best interest of the District that such property (the "Surplus Property") be disposed of promptly as hereinafter provided.

<u>Section 2.</u> The Superintendent or his designee is hereby authorized and directed to sell on a negotiated basis upon the most favorable terms and conditions obtainable all or any part of the Surplus Property as soon as reasonably possible. Any Surplus Property not thus sold shall be disposed of and removed from the premises of Swedish Edmonds Hospital at the direction of the Superintendent or his designee at the least possible cost to the District.

RESOLUTION NO. 2013-09

A resolution of the Commission of Public Hospital District No. 2, Snohomish County, Washington (the "District"), approving the dollar amount and percentage increase in the District's regular property tax levy for calendar year 2014.

WHEREAS, RCW 84.55.120 requires a taxing district, other than the state, that collects regular levies to hold a public hearing on revenue sources for the district's following year's current expense budget; and

WHEREAS, RCW 84.55.120 further requires the hearing to include consideration of possible increases in property tax revenues and requires that the hearing be held prior to the time the taxing district levies the taxes or makes the request to have the taxes levied; and

WHEREAS, RCW 84.55.120 authorizes the taxing district to hold a public hearing in conjunction with its annual budget hearing required by RCW 70.44.060(6); and

WHEREAS, a hearing in compliance with RCW 84.55.120 and RCW 70.44.060(6) was held on October 23, 2013; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners of the District, after hearing and duly considering all relevant evidence and testimony presented, determined that the District requires an increase in property tax revenue from the previous year, in addition to that resulting from the addition of new construction, increases in assessed value due to construction of electric generation wind turbine facilities classified as personal property, improvements to property and any increase in the value of state-assessed property, in order to discharge the expected expenses and obligations of the District; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED by the Commission of Public Hospital District No. 2, Snohomish County, Washington, as follows:

Section 1. The Board of Commissioners hereby determines that the District requires a regular levy in calendar year 2014 of 2.104,000 which amount is exclusive of the additional tax revenue resulting from the addition of new construction, increases in assessed value due to construction of electric generation wind turbine facilities classified as personal property, improvements to property and any increase in the value of state-assessed property, and amounts authorized by law as a result of any refunds made, in order to discharge the expected expenses and obligations of the District.

Section 2. The Board of Commissioners hereby approves an increase in the District's regular property tax levy for calendar year 2014 in the amount of \$20,563, which is a percentage increase of $\frac{1\%}{1\%}$ from calendar year 2013. This increase shall be in addition to the increase in tax revenue resulting from the addition of new construction, increases in assessed value due to construction of electric generation wind turbine facilities classified as personal property, improvements to property and any increase in the value of state-assessed property.

Section 3. The Superintendent is directed to certify to the County Assessor, no later than November 30, 2013, a copy of this Resolution showing its adoption; and to perform such other duties as are necessary or required by law to the end that the maximum levy capacity available to the District under chapter 84.55 RCW, as determined by the Washington State Supreme Court, is banked for use in future years.
